

- Ensuring facilitative planning regulations






- A place that is accessible, well sheltered and serviced for family/ friends to gather for events

- A pleasant place to sit and have a coffee or a meal and watch the street activity








IF NO, WHY?

- Historical art installations could provide information plaques, leading visitors to historical trails & visual attractions to complement the proposed bike trails
- Information about the area is not obvious to anyone who is travelling/visiting from outside of Mackay
- There is a lack of connectivity in public spaces in Finch Hatton and visitors are guided through town by the road
- More signage and an information centre with brochures and maps
- Needs a tourist hub



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IFYES, WHY?

- The main road goes through the town, it's therefore easy to navigate town and tourist spots
- The businesses in the main street are well set up to advise travellers on points of interest in the area however a tourist map on a billboard would help
- There are currently limited tourism opportunities, I don't feel like there a lot to navigate or understand
- It's only a small township and everything is central in the town area
- Easy to navigate, but not enough promotion on what it can offer

- Additional outdoor activities beyond the mountain bike theme; local tours

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

PLANNING FRAMEWORK



WHAT THE FRAMEWORK WILL DO

- Develop strategic land use opportunities that support and promote the establishment of the mountain bike trail/s and Finch Hatton as the trail town
- Facilitate appropriate land uses and densities commensurate to infrastructure required to service development;
- Respect development/environmental constraints and infrastructure availability and requirements
- Strategic land use planning of key sites and areas to identify potential land use and key connections
- Develop placemaking (public realm) and wayfinding opportunities
